

Our Mission

The Outdoor Discovery Center at Crooked Creek (ODC) mission is to provide an engaging experience to discover nature through education, recreation, and outreach.

About the Center

The ODC is operated by the Armstrong Center for Community Learning, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization. The ODC is situated on 30 acres and includes a meeting room that holds 40 people, a lodge-style great room with fireplace, a full kitchen, and overnight accommodations for 24 people. Displayed in the building is an extensive collection of mounted animals including raptors and other birds, large and small mammals, snakes and fish. The ODC also features nature trails including an interpretive trail, poetry trail, handicap accessible trail, pollinator garden, outdoor volleyball court, fire pit and picnic areas.

Located adjacent to the ODC is the 2,600 acre Crooked Creek Lake Park. The park includes a 400-acre lake for boating, fishing and swimming, sand beach, seven miles of nature trails, equine trail, disc golf course, playgrounds, etc.
